The first is distance and the second in cost. The question of how we can get there from here is important. The cost of air-fare, gas, room and board is also important. It's important enough that we need to re-think how we do business.

Its been said that all politics is local and I am almost at the point where I think the same is true of poetry. I offered to share my home with our Southern board members as a place to stay prior to the executive board meeting knowing the money saved would be significant. I learned from some of them the time had already been committed to local poetry events. That's a good thing. We all need to support local activities. I'm leaning toward a single face to face meeting each year at the annual convention. We could decide on a more or less permanent convention site (think Fresno), or not as the membership wishes. That would mean two or three electronic meetings each year and one face to face. We are required to hold three meetings each year but there's a lot of flexibility in the way we hold them. (i.e. face to face, e-mail, conference call) I am planning to hold an executive board meeting at the convention in May. So board members watch for a time and place.

Our nominating committee has done an excellent job and will bring forth a full slate of officers in May. We are, however, still lacking a person to become the Youth Contest Chair an appointed position once filled by Elaine Harper. This year the executive board has divided the several chores associated with the position and will fill it by committee.

I have a request directed mostly to those of you in the South who may have information concerning how Elaine did her job, who she used for judges and so forth. Did she leave behind records of any sort? Your help in this regard is appreciated.
